

#### **NEIL ARMSTRONG LEFT HIS SHOES ON THE MOON!**

After Neil Armstrong took one of the most consequential steps in human history, the boots he used to do so were discarded on the moon. In fact, both of the Apollo 11 astronauts who walked on the lunar surface - Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin — left behind their overshoes, along with their portable life-support systems. Leaving the gear wasn't a symbolic gesture; it helped to offset the added weight of collected moon rocks that the shuttle would be taking back. And the astronauts didn't return to Earth barefoot, either. The treaded overshoes they abandoned were worn atop flat-soled pressure boots, which they kept.

Holding celebrations to honor mothers is traceable back to the ancient Greeks and Romans. They held annual festivals in honor of the mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele. The celebration closest to modern times that may have spawned what's become traditional Mother's Day is the early Christian celebration known as "Mothering Sunday." The holiday originally fell on the 4th Sunday in Lent in the U.K. and parts of Europe. The custom faded over time eventually re-emerging in

popularity as the American Mother's Day in the 1930s and 1940s. It was officially declared a U.S. holiday in 1914, however.
